

I would like to thank everybody for the opportunity to head the Lake Management Team. Our five man team is dedicated to the ecology of the lake. I also appreciate the comments mostly good, some critical, but they will help me make more informed decisions.

The last five months have been a crash course in lake management. Lake treatments started later than usual because of the late spring. We treated 185 acres on 6-17 for numerous aquatic weeds with an approximately 90% success rate.

Our second treatment was on 7-24, we treated 70 acres for wild celery, algae and milfoil. As of 8-19 the weeds are going down the water is clear and the lake looks wonderful. As the summer season is coming to an end and the waters are cooling it is not looking like we will need to treat again this year.

I'm looking forward to fall, and just as a reminder try to keep as many leaves as possible out of the lake, as decaying leaves promote weed growth. For those of you who leave, have a safe a wonderful winter, see you in the spring.

FALL CLEAN-UP

The leaves will soon be falling and we will be outside preparing our gardens and lawns for the long winter months. However, in the fall there are a few important points to remember to help protect the water quality of the lake and your home:

Rake or blow leaves and clippings away from the lake. Leaves and clippings are loaded with phosphorus. Algae blooms can flourish if the lake becomes overloaded with phosphorus. Also, decomposing plant materials lower the levels of dissolved oxygen in the water, which can be fatal to fish and other aquatic organisms.

>Clean your beach/shoreline. If you are a lakefront owner, take time to remove the leaves that wash up on your shore or get lodged in rocks in front of seawalls. With the abundance of beautiful trees we have surrounding our lake, thousands and thousands of leaves find their way into our lake. By being proactive in removal of dead leaves, it will ultimately result in a healthier lake!

Waste Management will be picking up yard waste on October 3, 17 and 31, with the final yard waste pickup scheduled for November 14, 2013. And please remember – all leaves/yard waste **must be** in biodegradable bags or trash containers – Waste Management <u>will not</u> pickup yard waste in plastic bags. After November 14th, you can take your yard waste to the LOSRA yard waste site across from the boat launch. To access this site use the same key as the boat launch. Do not take trash (tires, cement, asphalt, old lumber, etc.) to this site, as it is prohibited.

Chimneys are an important feature of your home that should be properly maintained in order to keep your family safe. There are many hazards that can damage to chimneys and cause problems in your home. Every person living with a chimney should be aware of these issues and know the correct maintenance procedures. Whether you have a gas fireplace, wood stove fireplace, masonry or factory-built chimney, they all need to be inspected at least once per year. To prevent chimney fires, schedule an annual chimney and fireplace cleaning to be done by a certified chimney sweep. These sweeps will expertly clean your chimney, eliminating the black creosote buildup that occurs when a chimney is used and then cooled. When a chimney is clean, it has little risk of catching on fire. Remember that even if you don't use your chimney frequently, you should still get it cleaned once per year. Your chimney acts as a ventilation system not only for heat and smoke but also for harmful gases, such as carbon monoxide. And stay away from unseasoned wood - it contains a lot of moisture. Moisture in unseasoned wood will make it more difficult to light and will cause the wood to smoke. If the flame goes out on unseasoned wood, the wood will continue to smolder. Smoldering wood adds an unpleasant burnt smell to the house and creosote to chimney. To avoid this issue, the wood should be seasoned. Deciduous trees like oak and walnut are the best choice if you want to produce a lot of heat. Ash, locust, hickory, apple, plum, cherry, pear and ash come next, putting off slightly less heat. Maple, sycamore and elm are fair for heat production, while cottonwood, alder and willow are poor choices for heat production. Stay away from burning of any type of pine as the sap causes substantial creosote build up in your chimney.

And, while you're at it, why not check that dryer vent? Lint build up in the vent hose can cause a fire!
